The southern kingdom of Judah was threatened by the mighty Assyrian empire. Trusting in the one true God for protection, good King Hezekiah went right to the Lord in prayer. God answered Hezekiah in an amazing way.

What You Heard in the Word

- King Hezekiah responded to the Assyrian threat with faith and trust in God. He knew that only God could save Jerusalem from the mighty Assyrians.
- ▶ The Lord heard Hezekiah's prayer and answered in a mighty way! The angel of the Lord destroyed 185,000 soldiers in the Assyrian army, forcing Sennacherib to return in shame to his own country.





God tells us how to pray in the Bible. I don't think he would do that if he wasn't going to listen and answer. If we are Christians, God will always answer. It's just that his answers aren't always what we think they should be. Sometimes he answers right away and says yes! Sometimes his answer is no. And sometimes he answers years later in an unexpected way or in a way we'll never know about. Praying takes a lot of faith in God, but God is always faithful. God wants us to trust him and keep praying. Then when he answers, we should give him the praise and glory for what he does.
