



Lesson Focus

For hundreds of years, God warned Judah and called them to repentance through his prophets. But they refused to turn from evil, so God used Babylon to destroy Judah. The Babylonians killed most of the people of Judah, destroyed the temple of God, and took survivors to Babylon as captives.

What You Heard in the Word

- God used the nation of Babylon to conquer and punish Judah because the people would not listen to God's prophets and their warnings to turn back to God.
- ▶ The Babylonians brought total destruction to Judah: killing the people, destroying the temple of God, and taking the survivors to Babylon as captives.





Review Questions

- 1. Which evil king of Judah was supposed to obey King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon: Jehoahaz, Zedekiah, or Hezekiah? *Zedekiah*.
- 2. Since King Zedekiah refused to follow the Lord, what did the priests and the people do? They refused to follow God, too.
- 3. How did the king and the people treat God's prophets: welcomed them, listened carefully to them, or made fun of them and would not listen to them? They made fun of them and would not listen to them.
- **4.** What sins did Zedekiah and the people commit against the Lord? They worshipped false gods; they took idols into the temple; they refused to listen to God's prophets.
- 5. True or false: Jeremiah told the people that the Babylonians would capture and burn Jerusalem. *True*.
- 6. What did the officials do to Jeremiah when he tried to go visit his family outside the city? They beat him and put him in prison.

Killed both young and old people; stole the valuable vessels and treasures and took them to Babylon; burned the temple and the palaces; broke down the wall of Jerusalem; took some people back to Babylon.

- 12. How did King Nebuchadnezzar tell his commander to treat Jeremiah: throw him in prison, do him no harm, or make him a slave? *Do him no harm*.
