Review Questions

- 1. What did King Nebuchadnezzar command everyone to worship? A golden image/statue.
- 2. When would the people know it was time to bow down to the statue? When they heard music playing.
- 3. What would happen to those who did not worship the statue? They would be thrown into the fiery furnace.
- 4. Which three men from Judah refused to worship the golden statue? Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego.
- 5. Some of the Babylonians reported the three men to the king because: they were jealous of them, they wanted to do the right thing, or they wanted to protect them? *They were jealous of them.*
- 6. When Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego came before the king, what choice did they make: to obey the king or to obey God? *To obey God*.
- 7. What happened to the guards who threw Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego into the fiery furnace? *They were killed by the fire because it was so hot.*
