


### **Creation: Days and Kinds**

### Lesson Focus


The context of the Hebrew word *yom* in Genesis 1 confirms that the days of creation were normal 24-hour days. God created specific types of plants on Day Three to reproduce according to their kinds.

### Key Passages

Grades 2–3: Genesis 1:1–19 Grades 4–5: Genesis 1:1–19; Exodus 20:11

### What You Heard in the Word

- Yom, the Hebrew word for "day" in Genesis 1, means a regular 24-hour day.
- God made plants to reproduce "according to their kinds." This means that a plant can only produce a plant that is like itself.








# **Class Notes Answer Key**

- 1. Use a white board/poster board to draw the six days of creation during Lessons 13 and 14.
- 2. Divide the board into three equal areas using two horizontal lines and number the sections.
- 3. Explain that these three areas will be used to illustrate the events of the six days of creation.
  - Day 1 Draw line down center of circle and color one side dark.
  - Day 2 Draw clouds in the sky and waves along the bottom.
  - Day 3 Draw an area of dry ground and put flowers, trees, and grass on it.
  - Day 4 Add stars, planets, moon, and sun.



# According to Its Kind

#### Materials

- Fruits with large seeds (e.g., apple, orange, pear, avocado)
- □ Knife and board to cut fruit
- □ Piece of paper or cardboard and marker
- □ Tape
- □ Paper towels, paper plate

#### Instructions

Cut open each fruit you brought and remove the seeds. Let the students pick up and feel the seeds. Dry them off and then tape the seeds to the paper and write the name of the fruit under them. Allow students to sample the fruits.

#### **Suggested Discussion**

These pieces of fruit each have a different seed, don't they? God made all plants and trees to produce seeds. If you plant these apple seeds, what will you get? An apple tree! And if you plant these orange seeds, what will grow? An orange tree! Isn't God amazing? When he created the plants, he made them so they would make more and more. He made each one so it will reproduce and make more of the same plant and more seeds "according to its kind."

- 6. What else did God create to fill the sky? Planets, stars.
- 7. On what day did God create the sun, moon, planets, and stars? Day four.
- 8. The Bible tells us what God had to do to create the universe. What was that? *He spoke*.
- 9. Which attribute of God means he is all-powerful to do whatever he wants? Omnipotent.

And it was so. <sup>16</sup> And God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. <sup>17</sup> And God set them in the expanse of the heavens to give light on the earth, <sup>18</sup> to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. <sup>19</sup> And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.



### **OutWord** For Family Discussion

You may hear people say that the universe is millions of years old, that the book of Genesis is not literal, and that the days of creation were actually long periods of time. **What can you say to them?** 

It's always best to let the Bible speak for itself. The book of Genesis clearly describes each day as having an evening and a morning. I believe the days of creation were 24-hour days. You see, whenever the word "day" appears in the Bible with the phrase "evening and morning" and has a number like first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth—like it does in Genesis 1, it means a 24-hour day.
