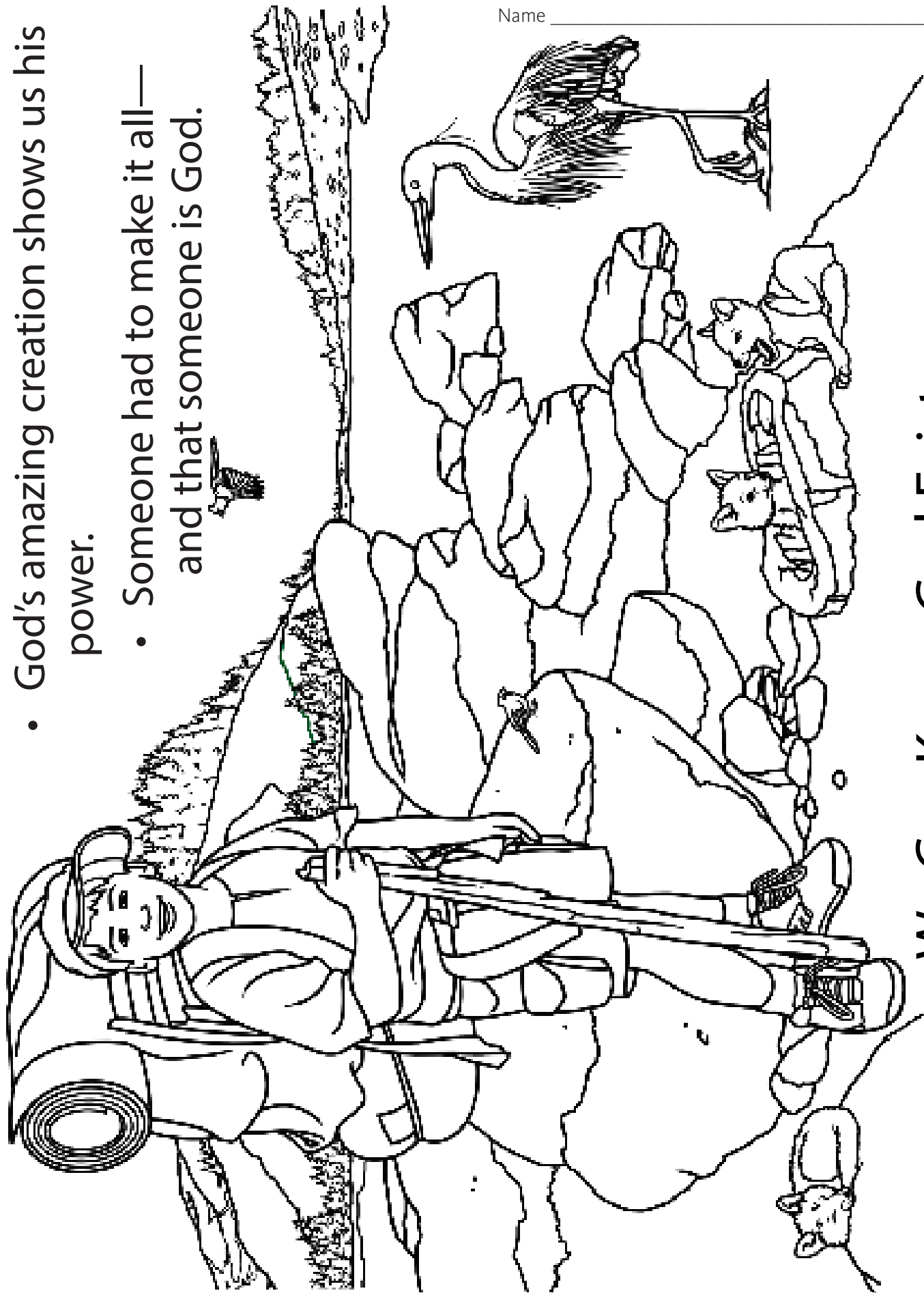

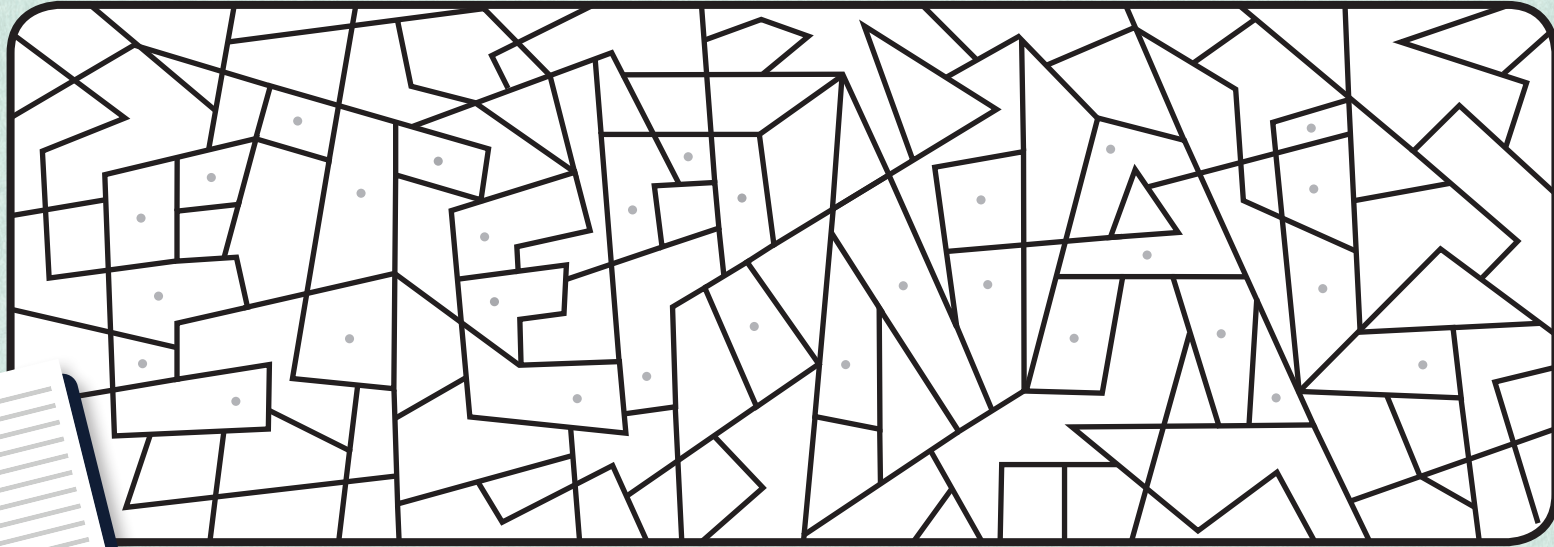

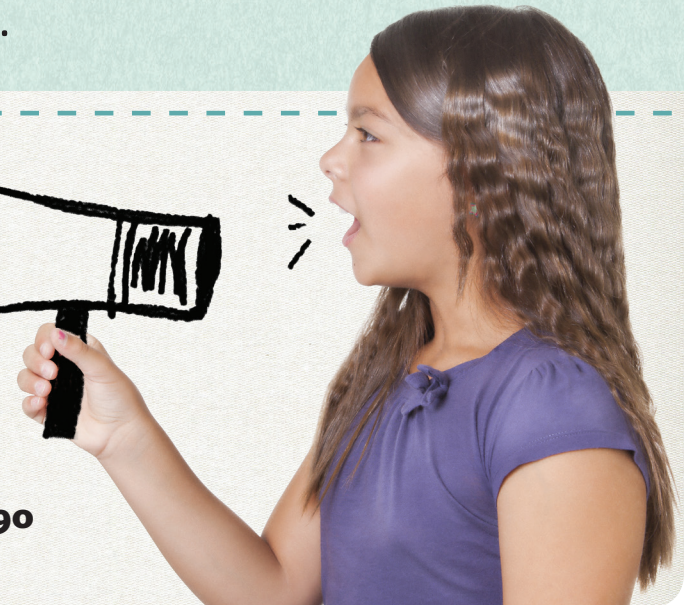

What You Heard *In the Word*

- God was the only one “in the beginning.” He is our eternal God—the Creator of all, and he is not bound by time in any way.
- The order in the universe, and all of creation, reveals that there is one true God—the Creator.

OutWord *For Family Discussion*

Your friend asks you, “Well, if you believe God created the whole universe, then who made God?”

How would you answer?

You are right to think that something or someone should logically make everything. But, there has to be someone who is forever. And that someone is the one who created the very first thing. He could not have been created—or there would need to be yet another creator to make him, and another to make him, and so on! The Bible says that the eternal one—the only one who has always been—the one who created everything and didn’t need to have a creator himself, is God.
