

## Lesson Focus

### OutWord For Family Discussion

Suppose your friend says, "I don't really sin that much. I don't think God would really send me to hell for the sins I commit. I mean, I never killed anyone or robbed a bank or anything." **What could you say?** 

Well, I know what you mean. I never killed anyone either! But we can't compare ourselves to other people—other people aren't holy. God is. The Bible says that we are all sinners and that all sin angers God, even sins like having a bad attitude or thinking unkind thoughts. If we don't repent of our sins and believe in Jesus, we will go to hell.
